a park connected to the city that is the center of relationship networks and solidarity;

INCLUSION

a place of expression of culture and of participation and sharing of choices, where no one is left behind;

SUSTAINABILITY

a sustainable event where development goals are achieved;

DIGITAL

a physical and digital experience;





WOMEN'S FREEDOM

where women can feel safe, supported and count in decisions.

Expo Roma 2030 will take the form of and represent a platform to relaunch female empowerment and freedom.

With this approach, women20 Italia supports Rome's candidacy for expo 2030, and is convinced that diversity brings creativity, stimulates innovation, develops ideas and relaunches opportunities, facilitates the development of a smart world. The greater valorization of women makes our societies takes a huge step forward, because it stimulates us to provide answers to real needs, to deal with all points of view.

The issue of women's rights and gender equality is urgent and crucial. It is a challenge that the international community has recognized as fundamental, not only with the inclusion of Goal 5 "Achieve gender equality" in the United Nations 2030 Agenda, but as an increasingly transversal objective in all United Nations goals.

With our entry into the field, we want to contribute to ensuring that Expo 2030 is not just a temporary event, but that it has a lasting impact in promoting understanding and action towards a more equitable and inclusive society where freedom develops female empowerment. And let it be a tangible commitment to promote gender equality, a fundamental prerequisite for a more equitable and sustainable society.

Even education, which represents a privileged path for the emancipation of women, is hindered in many areas of the world by numerous constraints and impediments of all kinds, such as segregation at home and the impossibility of attending educational institutions. In some countries, women are prohibited from pursuing academic studies. These incidents are just a few examples of the injustice that many women around the world face. In many countries, women are still subjected to the will of their fathers and husbands, forced into forced marriages, often at a young age, and even physical mutilations.

In this context, Expo 2030 in Rome can become a beacon of hope, a place to address these global challenges and work together to promote human rights and gender equality. We therefore strongly ask for your support for Rome's candidacy as the host of Expo 2030 and the possibility of





using this occasion as a springboard to address the crucial challenges that women and girls around the world face.
